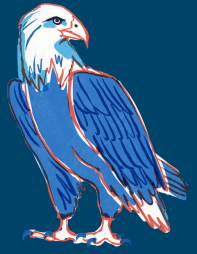

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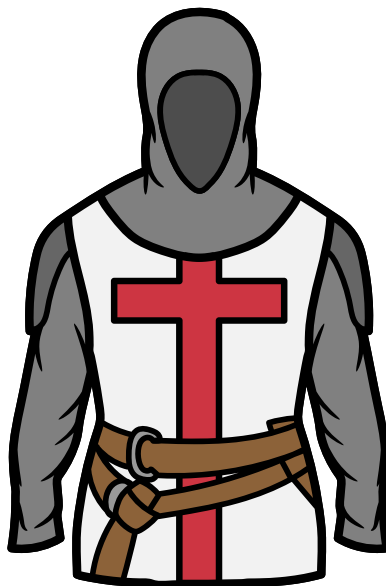
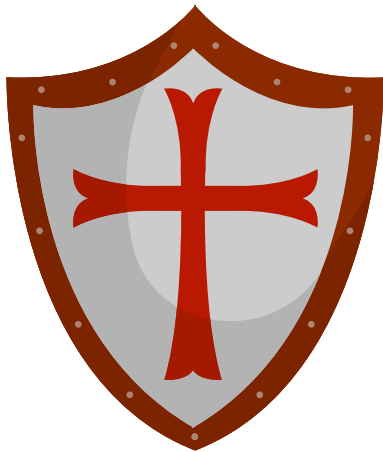
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Activity 2

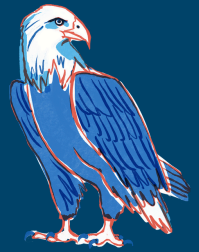

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Activity 4

The use and sale of indulgences was a key part of Martin Luther's protest station with the 95 Theses. The basis of indulgences was that the church had a bank of good or merit from those Christians who had died but had lived good lives in order to gain their salvation. Their "extra goodness" was kept in a "bank" that the pope could draw on, and he could sell or give these merits to others to prevent them from going to hell, or having these penalties imposed.

During the crusades, the pope promised full indulgence, ie full forgiveness, to those who volunteered to fight the Muslims. That meant they would be assured of going to Heaven, regardless of what sins they had committed

By 1500 there were indulgences that were printed letters. A person could pay money to receive a full pardon for all their sins with this letter. It was said that even people who had died and were suffering in purgatory, (which was like a waiting place where you waited until it was decided whether your soul would go to Heaven or hell), could be instantly freed to go to heaven, if a living person paid their indulgence and received a printed letter.

All the money that was received from the indulgence, went to build the church in Rome and some went to local princes and leaders.

Popes authorized giving indulgences away to those who agreed to perform some active charity, who gave alms (money) to the poor, who prayed a certain amount, who went on a pilgrimage or did other pious work.

What Bible verses show that the giving of indulgences is incorrect?

What would be the ramification or impact to the Catholic Church if people were able to read the Bible for themselves?



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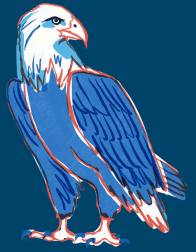


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Activity 5
